 - 2020 had new internet response option
 - More time to respond per covid delays for in-person interviews
 - Census sent more mailings with the extra time, boosting response

Lancaster County count was 2,500 more than Census estimates, thanks in part to improved self response.

Impacts:


- 1. Money: \$21,000 per person for decade from population-based formulas (so \$50 million more)
- 2. Power: increased political representation

Lincoln ranked #1 in self-response among 89 cities with 250,000+ people!!



Detailed population data show the size of the Baby Boom generation and their jump at age 75 as compared to the population size of their children (the Millennials) and grandchildren


Projected Lancaster County Population by Single Year of Age: 2022





The upcoming jump in age 75+ population from Baby Boomers aging into that demographic is clear and dwarfs recent growth


Decade Increase in Lancaster County Age 75+ Population: 1970 to 2050





For the first time in history our local senior population is going to exceed young children


Comparison of Lancaster County Under Age 5 and Age 75+ Populations: 1950 to 2010 with 2020 to 2050 projection





The "prime age workforce" has peaked, amplifying the worker shortage (began pre-covid & worsened)


Projected Nebraska Age 25-64 Population: 2010 to 2030





As men live longer, more couples are aging together, reducing widowed situations for women and how many women live alone. In addition, more older men are outliving their wife and then live alone.


Percentage of Nebraskans Age 65 and Older Living in Households who are Living Alone by Sex: 1990 to 2021
